Dear Residents,

As most of you know, the *Walton Hills Journal* has provided useful information to its readers during the last several years. It has been recognized as a credible, accountable, and transparent publication. We have reduced our operational costs by more than \$1.3 million during the last several years while keeping more than 75% of the *Walton Hills Journal* paid for with advertisements. The journal is delivered by the US Postal Service to more than 100 businesses, to all of our residents, and to other communities. The production and distribution of the journal costs less than what was ever paid prior to my tenure, for a Village publication. The *Walton Hills Journal*, compared to other communities' publications, has turned the page when it comes to keeping residents/businesses informed of the goings-on of Walton Hills. The Village has reduced operational costs and saved money, all while offering more services to our residents and businesses. We have reduced the 2017 budget by \$300,000 with reductions in:

1. **Administration – 15.4%**
2. **Service Department – 10.6%**
3. **Police Department – 9.2%**
4. **Recreation Department – 4.2%**

We have reduced our employment to 29 full-time personnel because of the failure of the police levy. The police department has been reduced to 10 full-time officers. The reduction of officers complies with the current police contract which states that we should have seven patrol officers and three sergeants. A full-time officer and all five part-time officers have been laid off. The safety of the people who live in Walton Hills, work here and travel through the Village

is priority one to our administration. The officers in the police department will continue to provide adequate assistance to **everyone**, despite the outcome of the levy election.

Despite the cutbacks, there is growth happening in Walton Hills. I'll take a more in depth look at the economic development in Walton Hills on page 4. We expect more production in the future to grow our economy and sustain our community over the next decade. Village Council members continue to develop good-working relationships with our business partners in order to renew the positive leadership roles once demonstrated during the 1980s and 1990s. Our community is committed to building quality relationships and providing a central location primed for businesses to thrive in Northeast Ohio. Walton Hills has a solid foundation to build on due to our tax base, services provided, our bottom line and the commitment from our safety forces. Council members continue to search for ways to improve our community now and in the future.

Please join us in honoring the men and women of Ohio who have given their lives while serving our nation with the War on Terrorism. The Ohio Flags of Honor traveling memorial will be in Walton Hills on Friday, August 25<sup>th</sup> through Sunday, August 27<sup>th</sup>. The opening ceremony on August 25<sup>th</sup> will begin at 6:00pm. The Hard Rock Rocksino is sponsoring the Ohio Flags of Honor at **no cost** to the Village of Walton Hills. ## Legislation Approved at the 7.11.2017 Special Council Meeting

**Resolution 2017-15** adopts the tax budget of the Village of Walton Hills for the Fiscal Year of 2018, directing that the same be submitted to the Auditor of Cuyahoga County.

**Resolution 2017-16** authorizes the Village Engineer to prepare bid specifications and advertise for bids for the South Meadowpark Drive Stream Restoration Project.

# Economic Development in Walton Hills

## What is going on in the Village of Walton Hills when it comes to economic development?

That's a question that I've been asked several times during the time that I've served as the mayor of our great Village. During my time in office, we've seen a lot of ups, and some downs when it comes to the economic development of Walton Hills. I'd like to share some of the positive growth that is happening in Walton Hills, with the expectation of the economic growth becoming a common theme now, and in our community's future.

**Transtar Industries:** Transtar Industries filed for Chapter 11 bankruptcy protection in November 2016. On April 12, 2017 the company overcame the bankruptcy and now has new ownership. On June 7, 2017 it was made known that the original owner and founder, Monte Ahuja, has returned as the CEO and Chairman of the Transtar Corporation. Monte Ahuja is also the Chairman of the Board at Transmaxx, LLC, a Solon-based distributor of driveline parts. The Village of Walton Hills has been notified that Transtar has signed a purchase agreement that will allow it to acquire the assets of Transmaxx LLC. The good news for Transtar Industries means good news for the Village of Walton Hills.



With Transtar recovering from its bankruptcy filing and the expansion of the company with the asset-addition of Transmaxx, the economic growth of the Village is inevitable. More people will be employed at the company, meaning more income tax will be coming into the Village of Walton Hills.

**Fuel Mart:** The new building and new landscaping at the Fuel Mart on Northfield Road will assist in beautifying the business area of the Village.

**Todd Industries Building:** The old building that used to be Todd Industries has been sold. The permits to repair and improve the building have been approved and we'll be working with the developer to move in another business to the building when the improvement project is finished.



**NPK:** NPK has started the process of taking ownership of another building located next to its existing buildings. That means that NPK will occupy four buildings in the Village of Walton Hills and will have more than 200,000 square footage in our community. The expansion of NPK is positively adding to Walton Hills' economic footprint.

The growth and expansion of businesses in our community can only be accomplished through good working relationships between our councilpersons and investors/business owners. We have to find the resources to build a better economy and we have to have the willingness to listen to the concerns of others. By doing this, the Village of Walton Hills and its residents will benefit in the long run.

The expansion of existing businesses and the addition of new businesses in Walton Hills will sustain our Village now, and in the future.

# Walton Hills Police Department Information

The Village of Walton Hills has received the resignation of our Police Chief, Kenn Thellmann. All parties have mutually agreed to accept the resignation and close another chapter of the Village of Walton Hills' operations.



**Former Chief of Police Kenn Thellmann has served the Village of Walton Hills in some capacity since high school. His service to our community is greatly appreciated.**

Mr. Thellmann has served our Village in many different ways for nearly 40 years. When he was 16 years old he began working for Walton Hills part-time in the service department. He has served as the chief of police for the last six years. Mr. Thellmann has brought many successful, positive programs and cost savings to the operations of the Walton Hills Police Department. He will truly be missed as the leader of our safety forces.

As we have stated numerous times, we have made reductions to our police department by eliminating our part-time officers as well as one full-time officer. On August 1, 2017 we eliminated the captain's position in the police department. Former Captain Stanley Jaworski has been promoted to interim chief of police. Along with the personnel changes in the WHPD, the gun and uniform allowances the officers and dispatchers (uniform allowances) used have been eliminated. With all of these reductions on the police force and with the elimination of the gun and uniform allowances, the Walton Hills Police Department's budget for the remainder of 2017 has been reduced by \$216,000.

## Ready Notify

Ready Notify is a notification system used by Cuyahoga County and participating municipalities to issue important announcements to the public. Ready Notify is primarily used for emergency notifications, however you may choose to be notified of other news as well. Contact information collected is secure and only used for the purpose for which it was provided. Participating in the Ready Notify Program is **voluntary**. A valid email and phone number will be needed to sign-up. If you don't have an email already, you can create one from the Ready Notify website: [www.ready.cuyahogacounty.us/en-US/ReadyNotify.aspx](http://www.ready.cuyahogacounty.us/en-US/ReadyNotify.aspx).

**Why type of notifications will I receive?** You can expect to receive notifications about: emergency events, Cuyahoga County government news, Cuyahoga County building closures, water boil alerts, safety messages, and other information.

**How will I receive messages?** When you sign-up in the system, you'll receive emails as well as have the opportunity to choose how you want to receive additional messages. Additional messages can be delivered in the following ways: cell phone, home phone, work phone, SMS/text messaging, and by fax.

# Diabetes and Kidney Disease Screening/Education

Did you know that 1 in 3 American adults is at risk for kidney disease? Medicare Part B covers preventive screening tests that help detect diabetes and high blood pressure – two conditions that may lead to kidney damage. For more information, visit: [www.Medicare.gov/coverage/preventive-and-screening-services.html](http://www.Medicare.gov/coverage/preventive-and-screening-services.html).

**Diabetes Screenings: How often is it covered and who's eligible?** Medicare Part B (Medical Insurance) covers screenings to check for diabetes. You may be eligible for two diabetes screenings each year. Part B covers these lab tests if you have any of these risk factors:

- High blood pressure (hypertension)
- History of abnormal cholesterol and triglyceride levels (dyslipidemia)
- Obesity
- History of high blood sugar (glucose)

Part B also covers these tests if two or more of these apply to you:


- Age 65 or older
- Overweight

- Family history of diabetes (parents, brothers, sisters)
- History of gestational diabetes, or delivery of a baby weighing more than 9 pounds

**Your costs in original Medicare?** You pay nothing for these tests.

### **Kidney Disease Education: How often is it covered?**

Medicare covers up to six sessions of kidney disease education services if you have Stage IV chronic kidney disease that will usually require dialysis or a kidney transplant. Doctors, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, and clinical nurse specialists can offer these services. Kidney disease education teaches you how to take the best possible care of your kidneys and gives you information you need to make informed decisions about your care. You'll learn about these topics: how to manage health conditions like heart disease, diabetes, high blood pressure and anemia, how your kidneys work, what you should and shouldn't eat, how your medications work, and your treatment options if your kidneys get worse.



**Who's eligible?** People with Medicare Part B (Medical Insurance) who have Stage IV chronic kidney disease (CKD). The doctor who manages your kidney disease must give you a referral for these services.

**Your costs in original Medicare?** You pay 20% of the Medicare-approved amount per session if you get the service from a doctor or other qualified health care provider, and the Part B deductible applies. Your Medicare Supplemental Insurance plan assists with these costs. Ringling Brothers and Barnum & Bailey Circus are taking down the Big Top and folding up the tents after 146 years. So, goes another part of Americana.
