The Village of Walton Hills held its annual Memorial Day Ceremony on Monday, May 29, 2023, in the Courtyard at Village Hall. The Keynote Speaker at the event was Congressman Max Miller who is serving his first term as the United States Representative for Ohio's Seventh Congressional District. Before joining Congress, Max Miller served as a senior advisor to President Donald Trump and spent six years in the Marine Corps Reserves.

Resolution 2023-16 Passed 5-0

A resolution authorizing the Mayor to apply to the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District for a potential grant for the funding of capital infrastructure improvement projects in the Village of Walton Hills, and declaring an emergency.

• This resolution would allow the Mayor to make an application to NEORSD for 2024 Member Community Infrastructure Program financial assistance for the Walton Hills Sanitary Sewer Study Phase 1 project.

Resolution 2023-18 Passed 5-0

A resolution adopting the tax budget of the Village of Walton Hills, Ohio for the fiscal year of 2024, directing that the same be submitted to the fiscal office of Cuyahoga County, and declaring an emergency.

• This resolution authorizes the Village to adopt the tax budget for the fiscal year 2024 and submit the budget to the Cuyahoga County Fiscal Officer.

Resolution 2023-19 Passed 5-0

A resolution accepting the amounts and rates as determined by the budget commission and authorizing the necessary tax levies and certifying them to the county auditor and declaring an emergency.

• This resolution authorizes the Village to adopt the necessary tax levies in accordance with the 2024 tax budget, directing that the same be submitted to the Cuyahoga County Fiscal Officer.

Resolution 2023-20 Passed 5-0

A resolution authorizing the mayor and the fiscal officer of the Village of Walton Hills to enter into a contract with Specialized Construction., for the resurfacing of Rotary Drive, and declaring an emergency.

• This resolution would award the resurfacing contract for Rotary Drive to Specialized Construction after the first contractor failed to provide signed contracts to the Village within 15 days.

Resolution 2023-21 Passed 5-0

A resolution authorizing the Mayor and the Fiscal Officer of the Village of Walton Hills to enter into a contract with Specialized Construction, Inc. ("Specialized") for the 2023 asphalt maintenance program, and declaring an emergency.

• This resolution would award the asphalt maintenance contract to Specialized Construction for the asphalt maintenance projects in the amount not to exceed \$61,050.

## **Congratulations Police Chief Stan Jaworski on Your Retirement**

On June 7, 2023, Police Chief Stan Jaworski retired from the Walton Hills Police Department. His career with Walton Hills began on October 1, 1991, when he was hired as a part-time officer. Two years later, in June of 1993, Stan became a full-time officer. ## MEDICARE SUMMARY NOTICES

For individuals on Medicare, you can receive information regarding you claims on the Medicare Summary Notice (MSN). It's a notice that people with Original Medicare get in the mail every 3 months if Medicare Part A and Part B-covered services were used in that quarterly timeframe. The MSN shows:

- All your services or supplies those providers and suppliers billed to Medicare during the 3-month period
- What Medicare paid
- The maximum amount you may owe the provider

As mail fraud seems to be escalating, individuals are sometimes uncertain of the validity and source of mail they may be receiving. There are a few markers you can look for on the envelope sent from the federal government to help you assure its validity:

- Return address indicates Center for Medicare & Medicaid Services
- Next to the address is the Department of Health & Human Services (DHHA) logo
- Look for this phrase on the front: OFFICIAL MEDICARE INFORMATION
- On the flap, on the reverse, will be a number you can call with any questions

You can choose to get an electronic MSN; On a monthly basis, if you had utilized Medicare benefits, you would receive an email linking to you MSN. You will not have to wait for the 3 months required for the paper documents to be mailed.

When you receive your MSN, you may want to compare it with medical services, supplies or equipment you have received over the last quarter. The MSN also notes any denials of Medicare coverage. If an item or service is denied, call your doctor's or other health care provider's office to make sure they submitted the correct information. If not, the office may resubmit. If you disagree with any decision made, you can file an appeal. The last page of the MSN gives you step-by-step directions on when and how to file an appeal.

If you do not have a Medicare account, go to medicare.gov to set one up. When this is done, select "Get your Medicare Summary Notices (MSNs) electronically" under the "My messages" section at the top of your account homepage. You will come to the "My communication preferences" page where you can select "Yes" under "Change eMSN preference," then press "Submit."
