













## Revitalizing Walton Hills: \$5 Million of Funding Secured over Five Years

Since 2019, the Village of Walton Hills has undergone a \$5 Million face lift! The Administration, Engineering Department, Building Department and Council have played an instrumental role in securing an impressive sum in grant funding, igniting a wave of positive changes and progress to improve infrastructure throughout the Village. These initiatives encompass a wide range of enhancements including road resurfacing, water main replacement, sewer testing, and sidewalk upgrades. This has resulted in improved roadways, enhanced reliability and efficiency of the village water supply, integrity of its sewer systems, sustainable transportation options for our eco-conscious community, and guaranteed safety measures for pedestrians and bike riders. Some of these noteworthy projects include:

- Upgrades to the Northfield-Alexander Roads intersection (\$350,000)
- Dunham Road and Tinkers Creek Road reconstruction and bike lane development (\$1.25 Million)
- Road resurfacings on Alexander Road (\$1.14 Million)
- Barclay Estates (\$250,000)
- Water main replacements along Tulip Drive and Rotary Drive (\$439,000)
- Ongoing sanitary sewer testing and inspection throughout the village (\$168,000)



In total, the Village has received support that equals roughly \$5,524 per household or \$2,420 per resident. These improvements will promote and improve the quality of life, maintain the country home atmosphere, retain and enhance safety and services for residents and businesses.

## Medicare Part D – Complete the Sheet

Medicare Part D is the Prescription Coverage of Medicare. You must apply for Part D, it is not automatic. Then review your coverage each year, during open enrollment from 10/15 – 12/7. Why? Because there may have been changes in your medications, formularies of what drugs the company covers and related costs. If a more cost-effective drug plan is available, you could save money.

If you don't want to join a Drug plan when you first get Medicare, you may pay a monthly premium penalty for as long as you have Medicare drug coverage, if you join later.

Complete the Sheet, this information allows for a confidential review of the best Part D plans for you personally.

- Only list prescribed medication, do not include vitamins and over the counter meds.
- If a medication is prescribed as PRN, estimate the general frequency of use and note it on the form.
- Make sure to use your current Medicare number, the most recent one you received.
- Listing your preferred pharmacy names and addresses helps provide you with a plan that is in network, resulting in lower costs.
- List a phone number (cell or home) that is easiest to reach you at, so you can get your information once completed.
- If possible, note an email address you can access, to receive your information, either at your home or that of a family member/friend. This greatly simplifies the process for you.
- Complete the attached sheet (please print clearly) or write ALL the requested information on a blank sheet and drop it off at the Recreation Department or email information to: kathleenkapusta1@gmail.com. If you email it, please call me (216) 538-0616 and leave notification of when you emailed it.
- Forward the sheet as soon as completed, as I will review them in the order they were received.
- You will be contacted and advised of your options between 10/30 and 12/1. Call me if you have not been contacted by that time.
