Economic Development Update

Forward Innovation Center East (Formerly the Ford Plant) site work is still ongoing and nearing completion. The first new 247,000 square foot building shell on the northwest corner of the site is finished. The Developer is still marketing the building for multiple and single tenants.

At their December meeting, the Village Planning Commission approved plans to construct a 249,000 square foot second building on the site. The new building will be located on the northeast corner. The developer is in active negotiations with a major health care company to lease the entire building. The Village will consider tax incentives for the second building at the January 9th Committee of the Whole and Special Council meetings. Once the lease negotiations and the incentives are approved the construction will begin.

MEDICARE CHANGES & COVERAGE FOR 2024

First, starting January 1, 2024, once your **out-of-pocket spending for medication** reaches \$8,000, you will automatically get **catastrophic coverage**. This means you will not be responsible for a copayment or coinsurance for covered Part D drugs for the rest of the calendar year.

Also, as began in 2023, Medicare drug plans can't charge more than \$35/month for each **insulin** product Part D covers, and no deductible applies. If you take insulin through a traditional pump, covered under Medicare's durable medical equipment benefit, that insulin is covered under Medicare Part B. You won't pay more than \$35/month and the Medicare deductible no longer applies.

As individuals age, an increased emphasis is placed upon the use of **vaccines** to maintain optimal health. The good news is that Medicare continues to cover the cost of many of these. Therefore, cost should not be a deterrent to getting vaccines to try to maintain good health, if you physician recommends.

Part B covers these vaccines: Flu, Hepatitis B, Pneumonia and Coronavirus (COVID-19). Be sure to bring your Medicare card when you get your vaccines, so your health care provider, or pharmacy, can bill Medicare. If you're in a Medicare Advantage Plan, you must use the card from your plan to get your Medicare-covered services and, like other covered services, your plan may require that you get the vaccine from an in-network provider, to cover the cost. Medicare Part D (your prescription plan) covers: Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis), Zoster (shingles), Varicella (chickenpox), RSV (respiratory syncytial virus) and Hepatitis B (for those at lower risk).

As of this time, Medicare is indicating that through December 31, 2024, you can get **telehealth services** at any location in the U.S., including your home. After this period, you must be in an office or medical facility located in a rural area for most telehealth services. However, you'll still be able to get certain Medicare telehealth services without being in a rural health care setting. Talk with your physician to verify if you qualify for these services into 2025.

For those suffering with **chronic pain**, the next Medicare benefit can be life changing. Medicare now covers monthly services to treat chronic pain if you've been living with it for more than 3 months (as confirmed by your physician). Services may include pain assessment, medication management, and care coordination and planning.

On the **mental health** side, Medicare will cover intensive outpatient program services provided by hospitals, community mental health centers, and other locations if you need mental health care. If you have a Medicare Advantage Plan, it may offer extra benefits, like certain types of mental health counseling not covered by Original Medicare.

On a final note, as insurance changes, always verify coverage in advance. Be a wise consumer.

DO YOU NEED ANY MEDICAL EQUIPMENT TEMPORARILY?

If so, the Recreation Department may be able to help you!

Sometimes we need medical equipment temporarily to help with our day-to-day living, items such as Crutches, Walkers, Wheelchairs and Shower Chairs. We now have a **Medical Equipment Loaner Program** available for your temporary needs.
