How is Walton HIIIs Legislation Passed?

When considering an ordinance or resolution for passage, Village Council has a few options concerning when a vote will take place and when the ordinance or resolution will become effective if it is passed. Under Ohio revised code (ORC), an ordinance or resolution is read three times before it is voted upon. We generally read them at our regular council meetings scheduled for the third Tuesday of the month. We can, however, read them at a special council meeting scheduled on another date. This gives the public the ability to learn of a proposal and voice their opinion if they wish.

Council debates and, if necessary, revises the proposal prior to agreeing to place the item on the regular Council agenda to be read. We work on these proposals at the Committee of the Whole (COW) meetings held the first and second Tuesdays of the month. This is why most proposals pass unanimously at the regular council meetings. The ordinance or resolution would then take effect 30 days after passage.

Ohio revised code allows for alternatives in order to keep the business of the municipality moving. Council has the ability to waive the three-reading rule and only read a proposed ordinance or resolution once or twice before voting on it. This is called suspension and must be agreed upon by threefourths of council. A proposal that would be considered for suspension would also be considered to be voted on under emergency, although an issue read three times could still pass under an emergency. Passage under emergency allows the issue to take effect immediately and would have to be passed by two-thirds of council. Examples of when we would do this is when contracts have to be signed or for the immediate preservation of health or safety.

Legislation passed at the last regular council meeting in 2023 under suspension and emergency was a retroactive compensation adjustment for employees, an agreement with the Ohio EPA for the redevelopment of property owned by the Village, appointment confirmations of two police sergeants, and 2024 temporary appropriations that had to be passed by December 31.
